Alternative Medicine

There are a number of medical practitioners that are licensed but don't go through the traditional paths of medicine in the country. These include Chiropractors, Acupuncturists, Naturopaths, Hypnotherapists, Reflexologists, and their assistants. While the names of the occupations are largely consistent, the scope of allowed practice varies from state to state.

Common Qualifications

Most states require a specific training program or nationally recognized certification (or both) as part of their licensure requirements.

Examples of License Titles

These are nearly universally licensed occupations. In the national occupational license database, there are 199 licenses that are clearly associated with alternative and complementary medicine, representing 54 states and territories. Chiropractors and Acupuncturists are licensed in nearly all those areas, while about half license assistants specific to one of those categories and a similar number license naturopaths.
