Executive Summary

Louisiana is home to a diverse economy and relies on an equally diverse and resilient workforce to bring it together. From manufacturing and construction investments throughout the state, to hospitality and tourism driven sectors, Louisiana has it all. As of June 2024, there were 2,075,002 people engaged in the Louisiana's civilian labor force with a civilian labor force participation rate of 58.6% that month. Louisiana's civilian labor force participation rate has increased by 3.3 percentage points since April 2020 and currently hovers around 58-58.5%. The state's total non-farm employment for the month of June was at 1,962,100 jobs and the unemployment rate was 4.0%. Although there have been more recent increases in total employment within the state, employment numbers have yet to reach the levels they were at pre-pandemic in 2020. Louisiana continues to recover from the impacts that the COVID-19 related health emergency and associated economic shutdowns had on the workforce. Impacts on access to childcare providers and increases in associated costs also stem from this event and contribute to the barriers keeping some parents out of the workforce in a full-time capacity.

Regions of the state have differing experiences related to geographic location, population demographics and industry composition in the area. The Baton Rouge region has been a consistent region in adding jobs in 2024 and has grown jobs by approximately 9% in the parishes that comprise the Greater Baton Rouge area. The healthcare sector remains the largest employer in Louisiana with 319,549 people employed in 2023. The ambulatory health care services industry of this sector is expected to experience the most growth in employment from 2022 to 2032 with an expected gain of 10,194 employees. In addition to healthcare occupations, skilled trade occupations are expected to experience the most employment growth in Louisiana over the next ten years. These occupations include those such as Welders, Electricians, Plumbers, and Boilermakers, all of which are needed across multiple industries and offer higher than average wages.



RLMAs are preferred for most reporting of Labor Market Information in Louisiana as they include all parishes in the state and regions.

Louisiana by Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA)




A Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) is a geographical area with a relatively high population density at its core and close economic relationships throughout the region. MSAs are defined by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) and are used by the U.S. Census Bureau, the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) and other U.S. federal and state government agencies for statistical purposes.

The minimum population needed for an urban area population to be denoted as a metropolitan statistical area (MSA) is 50,000 people.

Effective January 2025, Louisiana will begin reporting on a tenth MSA across all published reports that include MSAs. The **Slidell-Mandeville-Covington**, **LA Metropolitan Statistical Area** will be a single parish MSA out of St. Tammany parish.



Louisiana's population has decreased by 1.7% from July 1, 2020 to July 1, 2023. The state has continued to experience a decline since 2016.






Age Group Population Distribution by Sex


According to the 2021 Census Bureau data there are:

- 1,705,473 individuals who live in Louisiana work within Louisiana.





Seasonally Adjusted Unemployment and Numbers of Job Openings: January 2020 to June 2024




2020 - 2023 Employment Change by Parish


2023 Unemployment Insurance Benefits paid by Parish

Civilian Labor Force Participation Rate


In January 2020, Louisiana's labor force participation rate was 57.3% with an unemployment rate of 4.8%. The labor force participation declined and the unemployment rate increased significantly in April 2020 as COVID-19 cases surged and economic shutdowns were deployed. Select areas of the state, such as Lake Charles, also dealt with the fall out of the impacts of multiple named storms that took place in the state in 2020 and 2021. These events exacerbated the limited labor supply in this part of Louisiana.

The U.S. labor force participation rate was 62.6% in June 2024, four percentage points higher than the rate for Louisiana. In June 2024, the state labor force participation rate was up to 58.6% with an unemployment rate of 4.0%. Louisiana is in recovery from the pandemic impact but there is still much need for skilled workers in the state.

The civilian labor force consists of those who are employed and those who are unemployed and actively looking for work. Those who are not employed and not looking for work are not counted into the labor force. Most of the people in Louisiana who are not in the labor force report the reason as being retired. The civilian noninstitutionalized population age 16 and over is used for the labor force calculations. This population excludes anyone below the age of 16, anyone in the military or anyone who has been institutionalized (i.e. prison etc.).




Louisiana State University's Center for Economics, Business, and Policy Research (CEBPR) conducted a <u>study on Louisiana's Labor Force Participation</u> in 2023 for LWC. This study included a customized survey created by CEBPR and administered throughout the state. This survey sought answers as to why people do not participate in the labor force in the state. The most significant findings indicated that the leading challenges to joining the traditional civilian labor force are (1) family or child-care and (2) low wages for individuals who are not retired. This report also found that Louisiana has a large presence of people with disabilities that are not in the labor force, indicating another area where barriers into the labor force may exist.




Seasonal Adjusted Unemployment Rate and Labor Force Participation Rate: January 2020 to June 2024




2022 Labor Force Participation Rate Breakdown by Sex and Age



Labor Force Participation Rate Breakdown by Race and Sex (%)





Main Reasons for Not Working in Louisiana








Average Annual Pay in Total Covered Total

Per capita personal income





Distribution of 2022-2023 Employment Change by NAICS Sector



Distribution of 2023 Average Annual Wage by NAICS Sector






Industries with the Highest Job-Turnover Rates in 2023 Q2

Job-turnover Rates by Firm Age in 2023 Q2





Louisiana's Star Jobs

Louisiana produces long-term (10 year) forecasts for industry and occupational employment every two years. Once these occupational forecasts are completed, the results, along with job openings data and wage data, are used to develop Louisiana's Star Jobs rating system.

Jobs are rated on a scale from one to five, with five being the highest rating for occupations with the greatest demand and highest wages in the state. This methodology is also applied at the Regional Labor Market Area (RLMA) level.

The Star Jobs are tied to federal and state funding that supports training and educational programs for high-demand, high-wage occupations. Training programs linked to three-, four-, and five-star jobs qualify for funding assistance for trainees and students, provided they meet the other eligibility criteria.




Fastest-Growing 4-Star Occupations in Louisiana

New Orleans Regional Labor Market Area


Population Pyramid for New Orleans RLMA










Baton Rouge Regional Labor Market Area




















Population Pyramid for Alexandria RLMA











Monroe Regional Labor Market Area




Population Pyramid for Monroe RLMA











#### **LOIS** (Louisiana Occupational Information System) (previously "Scorecard")

A virtual Labor Market Information Web Portal that acts as an interactive site and gives users access to the latest Louisiana labor force, wage, population, industry employment, training programs, education, projections, job openings, demand occupations and more. Users can access all the labor market data Louisiana has to offer in one place and can easily filter the data to look at the time periods and areas they want to look at. LOIS is also tied into HiRE and allows users to login or create a login to the HiRE system, thus connecting them with even more resources.

# Labor Market Information Acronyms

#### **BEA-** Bureau of Economic Analysis

A division of the U.S. Department of Commerce that collects and disseminates data regarding different aspects of the economy.

#### **BLS – Bureau of Labor Statistics**

This agency within the U.S. Department of Labor is the primary data-gathering entity of the federal government in the field of labor economics. BLS employees collect, process, analyze and disseminate data relating to employment, unemployment, the labor force, productivity, price levels, family expenditures, wages, industrial relations and occupational safety and health.

#### **CC-** Continued Claims

A request filed for waiting period credit or payment for one or more weeks of unemployment. Participants must respond to questions concerning their request for continued claims. These claims are usually filed by mail, online or by telephone. The state will provide filing instructions. They are filed weekly or bi-weekly, any earnings from work during the week(s) must be reported.

#### **CES-** Current Employment Statistics

Estimates of nonagricultural wage and salary employment and production workers hours and earnings by industry. This is produced as part of a nationwide program in cooperation with BLS, for the state and each metropolitan statistical area (MSA) from a sample of employing establishments. This data is published in the monthly Labor Market Information Bulletin (PDF).

#### **CPS – Current Population Survey**

A monthly household survey of approximately 56,000 selected households in the U.S. conducted for BLS by the Census Bureau. The sample is on a rotational basis and respondents are interviewed to obtain information on the employment status of each household member age 16 and over, during the reference week.

#### ETA – Employment and Training Administration

This agency is a division within the U.S. Department of Labor that seeks to build up the labor market through the training of the workforce and the placement of workers in jobs through employment services.

#### **GDP-** Gross Domestic Product

Gross Domestic Product represents the total value of all goods and services produced within the borders of the United States. It is a measure of economic productivity. It also included any foreign owned products produced in the United States. Exports are included, Imports are not.

#### **RLMA- Regional Labor Market Area**

An economically integrated area within which individuals reside and find employment within a reasonable distance or can readily change jobs without changing their place of residence. RLMAs consist of all 64 state parishes.

#### SA-Seasonally Adjusted

Data that are adjusted to remove any seasonal effects, which result in a repetitive pattern from year to year. For example, employment in retail sales tends is consistently higher around the holiday season, and a seasonally adjusted series would not reflect this pattern. A seasonally adjusted number can be compared with other seasonally adjusted numbers in a particular series, while an unadjusted number can only be compared with another unadjusted number from the same month, quarter or week from another year. Seasonal adjustment allows for more flexibility in comparing across different areas, or months of data when looking for economic changes.

#### **SOC- Standard Occupational Classification**

A universal occupational classification system that is designed to cover all occupations in which work is performed for pay or profit, reflecting the current occupational structure of the United States.

#### **UI- Unemployment Insurance**

A program providing benefits to insured and eligible persons who are out of work due to conditions beyond their control

#### **UIC- Unemployment Insurance Claims**

This program helps cushion the impact of economic downturns and brings economic stability to communities, states, and the nation by providing temporary income support for laid-off workers.

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
