## WORKFORCE INFORMATION DATABASE (WID)

---

Kansas Labor Market Information Services (LMIS) maintains the most current version (2.8) of the WID and populates all designated core tables in accordance with Analyst Resource Center (ARC) guidelines through their web servicer Geographic Solutions, Inc. In addition to the designated core data tables, Kansas LMIS also maintains the following additional WID data tables: *demographics*, *education*, *income*, *cpi*, and *populatn*. Geographic Solutions, Inc. also maintains the *empdb* table for Kansas LMIS.

WID data is available for review on the Kansas Labor Information Center (KLIC) website at [www.klic.dol.ks.gov](http://www.klic.dol.ks.gov). Data can be displayed for several geographic areas including statewide, local workforce investment area, projection region, metropolitan statistical area (MSA), and county.

Kansas LMIS submitted occupational licensing data tables, *license* and *licauth*, to ARC in June 2024.

## STATE & LOCAL INDUSTRY & OCCUPATIONAL EMPLOYMENT PROJECTIONS

---

Short-term occupational and industry employment projections are useful sources of information for the planning and preparation of educational and training programs, assessing the need for skilled workers in the future, and studying short-term trends in occupational employment. The short-term projections are created every year and cover a two-year timespan. Short-term projections are produced for the state and each of the seven projection regions in Kansas. Kansas LMIS completed and submitted the 2023Q1 - 2025Q1 short-term projections in March 2024.

Long-term occupational and industry employment projections are useful sources of information for planning and preparation of educational and training programs, assessing the need for skilled workers in the future, and studying long-term trends in occupational employment. The long-term projections are created every two years and cover a ten-year timespan. Long-term projections are produced for the state and each of the seven projection regions. Kansas LMIS completed and submitted the 2020-2030 long-term sub-state projections in July 2023. The statewide 2022-2032 long-term projections were completed and submitted in July 2024.

Both long-term and short-term projections were completed using the methodology outlined by the Projections Managing Partnership. The Annual Economic Report is a compilation of several data sets collected and maintained by numerous research entities. ## Disability Report

The Disability Report is published annually and contains population and civilian labor force data by disability status for the state, each MSA, and every county in Kansas. This data is used by workforce planners and disabled workforce experts. The source data for this report comes from the U.S. Census Bureau's ACS. ## High Demand Occupations Lists

Kansas LMIS publishes high demand occupations lists each fall. The high demand list considers three measures of labor demand: current job openings, projected job openings over the next two years, and projected job openings over the next ten years. The high demand list also includes an indicator for occupations with high wages. An occupation is considered high wage if the occupation has a median wage greater than the median wage for all occupations in the region. High Demand data is also available by the Career Clusters designated by the Kansas State Department of Education (KSDE).

## Kansas Career Posters

Kansas Career Posters highlight potential career paths across various career clusters defined by the KSDE. Careers are selected based on their level of demand as well as their education, training, and experience requirements, as defined by the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). Each poster provides examples categorized by now, next, and later which highlight occupations students can obtain immediately after high school, along with future jobs they can work towards with more education, training, or work experience. Median annual wages from the most recent edition of the Kansas Wage Survey are also included for occupations listed on these posters.

## Quarterly Census of Employment & Wages (QCEW)

Kansas LMIS publishes quarterly and annual QCEW data including employment and wage data presented by industry and size class. QCEW data is published at the statewide, MSA, and county level.

## Today's Occupations

Today's Occupations is an occupational guide that showcases high demand, high wage jobs from our 2023 High Demand Occupations List that require less than a baccalaureate degree. The guide is organized by level of education required: no formal educational credential; high school diploma or equivalent; some college, no degree; postsecondary nondegree award; and associate degree. Additionally, users can find annual openings, the average annual growth rate, wage information, training and work experience information, a brief description of the occupation, and alternate job titles. Knowledge, skills, abilities, and technology commonly associated with each occupation from O\*NET are also included.

## PARTNER & CONSULT ON A CONTINUING BASIS WITH WORKFORCE INVESTMENT BOARDS & KEY TALENT DEVELOPMENT PARTNERS & STAKEHOLDERS

---

Kansas LMIS continues to work with workforce investment boards and other stakeholders. The interaction with different groups helps promote LMI in Kansas.

### Kansas Department of Corrections (KDOC)

Kansas LMIS partners with the KDOC by sharing wage and employment data which they use for their Prison Industry Enhancement Certification Program (PIECP). The purpose of the program is to enable prisoners to repay their debt to society, reduce incarceration costs, and prepare for release with improved work prospects. Kansas LMIS also performs displacement determinations as needed for KDOC so they can fulfill the requirements of the PIECP.

### Kansas State Department of Education (KSDE)

Kansas LMIS assists with Career Cluster reviews for the KSDE's Career and Technical Education program. The state has 16 Career Clusters that organize academic and occupational knowledge and skills to identify pathways from school to the workplace. Kansas Advisory Committees for KSDE reviewed seven of the Career Clusters this year. These committees include educators and industry experts. As part of the review process, the committees consider labor market data including employment and wages by occupation, projected job openings for Kansas, and high demand occupations in the state. Kansas LMIS met with each of the review committees to explain each data source and how it can be used in the review process, provided Excel documents with all relevant data for the Career Cluster, and provided follow-up information when requested.

During PY2023 Kansas LMIS also partnered with KSDE to send two sets of Kansas Career Posters along with two copies of Today's Occupations to each school in Kansas.

### Kansas Department of Commerce (KDC)

#### High Performance Incentive Tax Program (HPIP)

HPIP provides tax incentives to qualifying employers who pay above average wages, along with having a robust commitment to teach skills development for their workers. In support of the administration of HPIP, annually in June, Kansas LMIS provides the number of establishments, annual average employment, and annual average wage by three- and four-digit NAICS codes for the previous calendar year for metro counties and wage regions defined by KDC.

## **KANSASWORKS**

KANSASWORKS is the state workforce board to which Kansas LMIS provides support in terms of expertise and data for KANSASWORKS projects and initiatives.

- Kansas LMIS staff deliver presentations covering current economic conditions in Kansas during state workforce board meetings and respond to any requests for data or analysis. Upon request, Kansas LMIS delivers presentations and training to workforce centers regarding the use of the Kansas LMIS KLIC website, LMI data, current economic conditions, and special topics of interest.
- Kansas LMIS provides claimant contact information to workforce centers on a weekly basis so that they may reach out to claimants about workforce services available to them while unemployed.
- Kansas LMIS also provides workforce centers with printed materials advertising the Kansas LMIS KLIC website and LMI data and services to hand out at their workforce centers.

## **REEMPLOYMENT SERVICES & ELIGIBILITY ASSESSMENTS (RESEA)**

There is a national vision for reemploying Unemployment Insurance (UI) claimants. Kansas LMIS continues its partnership with KDC and the U.S. Department of Labor to operate a RESEA program wherein certain profiled claimants are selected to participate in proven reemployment activities. Kansas LMIS provides county level monthly unemployment rates to assist with the RESEA profiling model each month when new LAUS data is released.

## **WORKFORCE INNOVATION & OPPORTUNITY ACT (WIOA) FUNDING ALLOCATION FORMULA**

Kansas LMIS assists KDC with the process of determining program allotments by local workforce investment area for the WIOA Title I Adult and Dislocated Worker and Youth Activities Program and the Wagner-Peyser Act Employment Service Program. Kansas LMIS collects data and calculates the funding allocations based on formulas provided by ETA.

## **WIOA STATE PLAN ASSISTANCE**

During the fall of 2023, Kansas LMIS worked with KDC to draft the 2024 State Plan. Kansas LMIS provided the Economic and Workforce Analysis sections for the state and each of the five local workforce investment areas.

The Economic Analysis section of the plan covered the industries and occupations with existing and emerging demand as well as the employer's employment needs with respect to knowledge, skills, and abilities required, as well as education credentials and licenses.

The Workforce Analysis section covered current and historical labor force statistics and trends, including data for disabled Kansans. Additionally, this section included analysis of trends in population growth and decline, high demand occupations, and employment levels. Kansas LMIS also analyzed education and skill levels of the Kansas workforce, as well as skills gaps related to numeracy and literacy.

## Workforce Data Quality Initiative (WDQI)

Kansas LMIS partnered with the KDC, Kansas Board of Regents, and the KSDE on the WDQI Grant to create the Kansas Career Navigator website. The Kansas State Longitudinal Data System (SLDS) built linkages between education, labor data, and workforce systems for program evaluation. WDQI expanded the SLDS to connect workforce systems to education, including basic adult programs. The creation of a collaborative web-based dashboard includes information on Kansas education providers, LMI high demand and occupational wage data, and training programs. Consumers have real-time information with easily accessible LMI information including, but not limited to, high demand occupations, earnings information, current job vacancies, training providers for credentials, estimated costs per training, and related statistical information by local workforce investment area.

## OTHER ACTIVITIES

### Career Fairs & Conference Vendor Booths

LMI data can be a very useful tool for career exploration and planning. Kansas LMIS has been hosting vendor booths at various career fairs promoting LMI data to students and educators. Each booth typically showcases our Kansas Career Posters and flyers with information about the data hosted on the KLIC website as well as how they can use LMI data in their career exploration and planning activities. Kansas LMIS also purchased pens and “Data dog” stress balls with links to the KLIC website printed on them to help promote LMI data. Kansas LMIS also has laptops available at the booths so they can show off the KLIC site and guide users through some of the data.



## Constant Contact

To reach a larger audience, Kansas LMIS has implemented the use of Constant Contact email marketing software to announce when new reports or data products are available. Kansas LMIS now has a link for customers to sign up for this service on the KLIC homepage and printed materials. The link is also promoted on KDOL social media platforms when appropriate.

In 2024 Kansas LMIS pivoted to a monthly newsletter after some customers unsubscribed and indicated they received too many emails. At that time Kansas LMIS was sending roughly one email per week. ## Special Data Requests

Fulfilling special data requests is a key service provided by Kansas LMIS to its customers. Kansas LMIS responded to 338 special data requests received for labor market and unemployment insurance data from July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024. This is lower than the previous year as requests for UI data diminished with the overall economic recovery. Going forward, as promotion of the redesigned website continues, we expect to see request numbers and website traffic rise.

## Today's Occupations, Tomorrow's Opportunities (TOTO) Website

Kansas LMIS has partnered with Geographic Solutions, Inc. to produce a career hub website that will engage students early and often in career exploration and planning activities. Today's Occupations, Tomorrow's Opportunities (TOTO) will encourage discovery of interests and talents, as well as identify pathways and experiences that lead to real employment opportunities.

TOTO will be implemented as a portal on the existing KLIC website and will utilize the same database. This enables the sharing of resources such as the WID and other LMI data, along with Geographic Solutions, Inc.'s job postings data, which will enhance the user's career exploration experience. While the data is shared, the functionality of the TOTO website is very different from KLIC. TOTO presents the shared data in a way that users of all levels will be able to make sense of it and utilize it to guide their career planning through a wide variety of available tools.

Kansas LMIS also partnered with New Mexico Department of Workforce Solutions, who shared the code for their "Why I Work" reality check web application. Kansas LMIS is currently working with its internal IT department to modernize this application and tailor it to Kansas' needs. This application will help users realize the salary they need to earn, based on lifestyle choices they make. For example, users will select the type of housing they plan to live in, the car they would like to drive, how much they plan to spend on services, groceries, utilities, etc. Upon completion of all the questions in the application, users will receive a salary estimate that they can pair with other LMI data to enhance their career exploration experience. As the name of the application implies, it can also serve as a "reality check" for users who do not have much or any knowledge of the cost of living and the types of expenses they will need to consider as adults living independently.

## Unemployment Insurance (UI) Support Activities

Kansas LMIS is tasked with the following UI support activities:

- Annually in April, Kansas LMIS calculates the UI tax rate the state of Kansas will pay on its own employees.
- Annually in May, Kansas LMIS calculates the UI tax rate for governmental employers.
- Annually in May, Kansas LMIS calculates the minimum and maximum weekly benefit amounts allowed to claimants.
- Annually in October, Kansas LMIS determines the solvency of the UI Trust Fund and determines which rate schedule experience rated employers will pay from in the upcoming calendar year.
- Every month when LAUS estimates are released, Kansas LMIS calculates the number of benefit weeks available to new claimants.

Additionally, Kansas LMIS worked diligently with stakeholders to reform UI tax laws during Kansas' 2024 legislative session.

## LMIS Director Chairs LMI Institute

LMIS Director Angela White is the incoming chair for the LMI Institute. She recently provided the FutureVision Keynote address, where she shared her plans and ideas for the 2024-25 term for the Institute. The LMI Institute is recognized as the primary source for supporting the development, interpretation, and use of labor market information.
